Forwarded herewith for the approval of the State Civil Service Commission is a classification resolution approved by the Mayor to amend the classification of the Classified Service of the City of New York by classifying the above titles in the Non-Competitive Class.

Citywide Equal Employment Opportunity

A public hearing was held on May 4, 2009 to consider this proposal, and the record was held open for written submissions until May 8, 2009. As part of the DCAS Five-Year Plan to reduce the number of provisional employees, we proposed a number of classification actions to classify current temporary titles in the non-competitive class. This is one such action.

Part II positions receive Civil Service Law Section 75 disciplinary procedures, pursuant to Rule 3.2.3 (b) of the Personnel Rules and Regulations of the City of New York, after 5 years of service.

Employees hired into City Service on or after 2.01.07 shall be paid at least the "Hired After 2.01.07 Minimum" rate. Upon completion of two years of active or qualified inactive service, such employees shall be paid no less than the indicated "Incumbent Minimum" for the applicable title that is in effect on the two year anniversary of their original appointments. In no case shall an employee receive less than the stated hiring minimum.
