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Introduction

Background

This is the Department of Civil Service's fourteenth annual report, "New York State Government Employees' Workers' Compensation Claims." The report includes workers' compensation experience from five fiscal years (2016-17 through 2020-21).

Section 7 of the Civil Service Law was amended in Chapter 171 of the Laws of 2007 (Appendix A of this report) to require that the President of the Civil Service Commission prepare an annual report describing occupational injuries, illnesses, and workers' compensation claims in Executive Branch state agencies. The report is required to be published by September 30th each year and includes workers' compensation data based on the last completed fiscal year, as well as comparative data for up to five fiscal years.

The report format follows the sections specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, with the exception of Table 3A which consolidates subdivisions (**6d**) and (**6e**) of the legislation. Further, Table 3B, which is not required by the statute, displays five years of total compensation and medical payments made during the applicable fiscal year for <u>all</u> incidents occurring on or before the end of the fiscal year.

The Department of Civil Service's Employee Benefits Division is responsible for overseeing the workers' compensation policy between New York State and the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF). Part of this responsibility includes the reporting and monitoring of work-related incidents through the Accident Reporting System (ARS) and workers' compensation claims experience provided by NYSIF. Workers' compensation data for this report was obtained from both the ARS and NYSIF since neither source alone contains all the statutorily-required data elements.

Incidents were reported up to June 30th of the reporting year, with incident dates occurring during the fiscal year. A 15-month reporting period was used to capture more complete incident activity that occurred during the fiscal year. There were 817 ARS-reported COVID-19-related incidents, which are captured in this report and are seen as Injury Type "Covid-19 Coronavirus" in Table 4A, as Incident Cause "Pandemic" or "Inhalation of Substance" in Table 4B and as an increase to reported Lung-, Chest- and Upper Extremities-related injuries in Table 4C. NYSIF reports slightly higher counts of COVID-19 incidents (962) when including incidents first reported to the Workers' Compensation Board (WCB), rather than through ARS, as well as first receipt of medical including first fill prescription(s).

It should be noted that there are differences in the number of work-related incidents contained in the respective data reported from the ARS and NYSIF. There are incidents that are submitted to ARS, but a corresponding claim is not created in the NYSIF system (e.g., due to no lost time or medical costs). Conversely, there may be claims for which a report was not made in ARS. Employee population data is obtained from the Department of Civil Service New York State Electronic Personnel System (NYSTEP).

Incident counts will be described in detail throughout the report. Statewide, there were reductions in the number of incidents but the incidents that occurred resulted in a larger number of lost days. On an industrywide basis, the Workers' Compensation Board has noted similar trends, including: a reduction in the overall volume of claims filed and a relatively higher percentage of lost time claims. Although the Board issued emergency regulations to allow telemedicine at the inception of the pandemic (on March 16, 2020), overall, there were fewer medical services incurred (on average 18% less in FY 2020-21).

Although this report presents only summarized data, New York State agency Human Resources and Health and Safety staff are encouraged to use the reporting capabilities of the ARS. The ARS allows for much greater detail of the information presented in this report, as well as many other workers' compensation incident details.

Explanatory Notes

The report *includes* selected Executive Branch agencies' Classified Service employees, consistent with subdivision three of section two-a of the State Finance Law. Specifically, employees represented by the following public employee unions are included: CSEA; PEF; NYSCOPBA; Council 82; PBANYS as well as Management/Confidential. The report *excludes* the Judicial and Legislative branches, as well as the Unclassified Service and Authorities (e.g., Financial Control Board, SUNY College of Ceramics) as the Department of Civil Service does not maintain employee data on these groups. Please note that incident counts in Tables 1, 6, and 7 for years 2016-17 and 2017-18 differ from Annual Reports published prior to 2019. This is due to a programming error that was identified (and corrected in 2019) which excluded approximately 1,700 claims per year.

There were two correctional facility closures at the end of the fiscal year – Gowanda and Watertown. One new state agency - the Office of Renewable Energy Siting (ORES) - was established effective April 3, 2020.

Information in this report is based on New York State workers' compensation claims filed by employees. Although the reporting period is for the Fiscal Years (FY) ending March 31st, claims for fiscal years were reviewed through June 30th of the respective reporting years to allow for late reporting, and for data to be captured for workers' compensation determinations made after the end of the fiscal year.

Incident data included in this report are for work-related incidents (either injuries or occupational illnesses) that were reported to the Workers' Compensation Board and NYSIF as required by the New York State Workers' Compensation Law. The Law requires reporting of all incidents that result in either: one or more lost workdays or shifts beyond the working day or shift on which the incident occurred; or medical treatment beyond first aid or two or more first aid treatments. There are many incidents that do not reach the level of the reporting criteria under the Workers' Compensation Law. Incident Rates in Table 5 can be over 100 given that multiple incidents may occur for the same individual and due to staff turnover (FTE counts are point-in-time and an incident may be counted for an individual no

longer on the agency's payroll).

As historically reported, this report includes certain statutory temporary disability workers' compensation costs incurred by Executive Branch employees and paid by the State Insurance Fund for one day up to 365 days' post-incident (based on the date the injury occurred within the fiscal year). For example, an accident that occurs on April 1st could have up to 365 days of compensation, whereas an accident that occurs on March 31st could have only one day of compensation reported. Please note that the report includes Table 3B, which reports total compensation and medical payments made during the reported fiscal year, for all incidents occurring on or before the end of the fiscal year (i.e., payments for all open claims).

Summary of Findings

Highlights are presented below for Executive Branch agency workers' compensation incidents for classified employees incurred in FY 2016-17 through FY 2020-21.

- There were 12,731 work-related claims in FY 2020-21 compared to 14,566 work-related claims in FY 2019-20; 14,144 work-related claims in FY 2018-19; 14,834 work-related claims in FY 2017-18, and 14,973 work-related claims in FY 2016-17. The overall workers' compensation incident rate decreased from 10.2% to 9.3% (Table 1, page 8).
- There were 4,881 lost-time incidents in FY 2020-21, up from 4,543 in FY 2019-20. Approximately 38.3% of workers' compensation incidents in FY 2020-21 resulted in lost time (up from 31.2% in FY 2019-2020) (Table 2A, page 17).
- The lost-time incident rate for FY 2020-21 saw an increase to 3.6% from 3.2% in 2019-20. In FY 2020-21, 319,153 workdays were lost compared to 287,465 lost workdays in FY 2019-20 (Table 2B, page 17).
- *Total first year compensation costs* increased while *total medical costs* decreased from FY 2019-20 to FY 2020-21. Total compensation costs increased by 7.1% from \$32,053,151 to \$34,336,525. Total medical costs decreased by 6.8% from \$28,145,378 to \$26,224,647 (Table 3A, page 34).
- Total compensation costs for all open claims increased from \$357,833,794 in FY 2019-20 to \$374,118,490 in FY 2020-21. Total medical costs for all open claims decreased from \$82,284,793 in FY 2019-20 to \$79,749,270 2020-21 (Table 3B, page 34).
- Soreness, Pain, Hurt Excluding the Back continues to be the category of incidents with the highest incident rate at 38.0% for FY 2020-21, down slightly from 38.5% in FY 2019-20. Sprains, Strains, Tears again ranked second with an incident rate of 16.3% for FY 2020-21, down from 17.3% in FY 2019-20 (Table 4A, page 54). Readers will see that COVID-19 Coronavirus is a top five incident, with an incident rate of 5.5%, up from 2.1% in FY 2019-20.
- For the fifth consecutive year, the two leading incident causes in FY 2020-21 were: *Bodily Reaction and Exertion* (but the overall number of incidents decreased by 7.8% from 1,984 to 1,830), and *Patient Restraint* (which decreased by 18.7% from 1,491 to 1,212) (Table 4B, page 54).
- The following were the reported top three body parts injured in all five fiscal years: *Shoulder, Including Clavicle, Scapula* (13.2% incident rate); *Knee(s)* (13.1% incident rate); and *Back, Including Spine, Spinal Cord* (6.0% incident rate) (Table 4C, page 54).

- The three job titles with the highest number of work-related incidents for the third consecutive year were: Correction Officer, Direct Support Assistant, and Mental Health Therapy Aide. Security Hospital Treatment Assistant had the highest incident rate of 109.4% in FY 2020-21, however, work-related incidents for this title decreased from 737 in FY 2019-20 to 618 in FY 2020-21. Security Hospital Senior Treatment Assistant had the second highest incident rate of 88.4% in FY 2020-21, which is a decrease from 98.9% in FY 2019-20. The job titles with the most significant increase in FY 2020-21 were: Teaching Hospital Sterile Supply Technician 1 (incident rate of 11.7%, up from 6.3% in FY 2019-20), and Vocation Instructor 4 (incident rate of 12.5%, up from 7.1% in FY 2019-20) (Table 5, page 64).
- The two facilities with the highest incident rates in FY 2020-21 were the *Rockland Psychiatric Center for Children & Youth* (incident rate of 54.4%, up from 29.1% in FY 2019-20) and the *Mid-State Correctional Facility* (incident rate of 49.0%, up from 36.5% in FY 2019-20) (Table 6, page 67).
- In FY 2020-21, Security Services Unit Non-Arbitration had the highest incident rate (38.8%), and All Other Units and Unrepresented Group had the lowest incident rate (1.3%) (Table 7, page 71). The Security Services Unit had the second highest incident rate of 25.4%, up slightly from 25.1%.

Table 1: Workers' Compensation Incident Details

Selected New York State Agencies: Fiscal Years 2016-17 through 2020-21

Table 1 lists the selected Executive Branch New York State agencies' workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision (**6a**). The information in Table 1 was provided by NYSIF. The FY 2020-21 claims experience includes accidents occurring between April 1, 2020, and March 31, 2021, and reported through June 30, 2021. As indicated in the Explanatory Notes, incident counts in Tables 1, 6, and 7 for years 2016-17 and 2017-18 differ from Annual Reports issued prior to 2019. This difference is due to a programming error (corrected in 2019) which excluded approximately 1,700 claims per year.

Agencies reported a total of 12,731 workers' compensation incidents and an incident rate of 9.3% in FY 2020-21, compared to 14,566 incidents and an incident rate of 10.2% in FY 2019-20. Previous years reported: 14,144 incidents and an incident rate of 10.0% in FY 2018-19; 14,834 incidents and an incident rate of 10.5% in FY 2017-18; and 14,973 incidents and an incident rate of 10.5% in FY 2016-17.

The overall incident rate is down overall (9.3% versus 10.2% last year), likely due to telecommuting in administrative agencies during the pandemic. Agencies that continued to operate in-person due to direct care responsibilities (e.g., OMH, OPWDD, DOH, Parks, SUNY) generally also saw reduced incident rates, except for DOCCS. DOCCS saw a total rate increase of 0.6 percentage points from FY 2019-20 to FY 2020-21. Rates of decrease in large Departments ranged from 0.4 to 2.5 percentage points in the Department of Health and the Office of Mental Health, which saw a decline from 20.3% in FY 2019-2020 to 17.3% in FY 2020-21.

Tables 2A and 2B: Workers' Compensation Lost Time Selected New York State Agencies: Fiscal Years 2016-17 through 2020-21

Table 2A and **Table 2B** list the selected Executive Branch agencies' workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivisions (**6b**), and (**6c**). The FY 2020-21 claims experience includes accidents occurring between April 1, 2020, and March 31, 2021, and reported through June 30, 2021. The FY 2019-20, 2018-19, FY 2017-18, and FY 2016-17 claims experience is the same data reported in last year's report.

The number of lost-time incidents increased by 7.4% in FY 2020-21 to 4,881, up from 4,543 in FY 2019-20. The lost-time case rate (the number of Lost Time Incidents divided by the number of Incidents from Table 1) increased to 38.3% in FY 2020-21, up from 31.2% in FY 2019-20.

The lost-time rate (the number of Lost Time Incidents divided by the number of Full Time Equivalents) increased to 3.6% in FY 2020-21 from 3.2% in FY 2019-20. The number of lost workdays increased by 11.0% in FY 2020-21 to 319,153, up from 287,465 in FY 2019-20.

Lost workdays increased at the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision. In 2019-20, there were 79,222 lost workdays while in 2020-21 there were 104,776 lost workdays (significant increases were seen at Fishkill Correctional Facility and Wende Correctional Facility). Lost workdays also increased at the Office of Mental Health by 6.8%, from 62,788 FY 2019-20 to 67,086 in FY 2020-21. The Office of Children and Family Services also saw more lost workdays – from 15,803 in FY 2019-20 to 18,375 in FY 2020-21 (an increase of 16.3%).

Conversely, lost workdays decreased at the State Education Department by 72.2%, from 774 in FY 2019-20 to 215 in FY 2020-21. Lost workdays also decreased at the Department of Health by 2.9%, from 3,784 in FY 2019-20 to 3,674 in FY 2020-21.

Table 3A and 3B: Workers' Compensation Costs by Selected New York State Agencies: Fiscal Years 2016-17 through 2020-21

Table 3A lists the selected Executive Branch New York State agencies and contains the workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivisions (**6d**) and (**6e**). The claims experience in Table 3A was provided by NYSIF. The FY 2020-21 claims experience includes incidents occurring between April 1, 2020, and March 31, 2021, and paid through June 30, 2021. The FY 2016-17, FY 2017-18, FY 2018-19 and FY 2019-20 claims experience is the same data reported in last year's report.

The compensation costs included in Table 3A only represents certain statutory temporary disability workers' compensation costs incurred by Executive Branch employees and paid by the State Insurance Fund for one day up to 365 days post-incident (based on the date the injury occurred within the year). For example, an accident that occurs on April 1 could have to up 365 days of compensation whereas an accident that occurs on March 31st could have only one day of compensation reported.

Under New York State Workers' Compensation Law, employees who are disabled due to a workers' compensation incident are entitled to a wage replacement for lost salary and medical benefits related to the incident. The wage component is equal to two-thirds of the employee's average weekly wage, not to exceed a maximum established under the Workers' Compensation Law. The statutory maximum for the past five years is as follows:

July 2016 – June 30, 2017	\$864.32
July 2017 – June 30, 2018	\$870.61
July 2018 – June 30, 2019	\$904.74
July 2019 – June 30, 2020	\$934.11
July 2020 – June 30, 2021	\$966.78

The data in Table 3A does not include supplemental wage replacement benefits as these amounts are paid by individual agencies and are not reflected in data maintained by NYSIF. Under the medical component, all medical treatments – including doctor treatments, hospital or clinic charges, imaging services and diagnostic testing, prescription medication, and other related medical services – are paid in full based on a fee schedule established by the Chair of the Workers' Compensation Board, pursuant to the Workers' Compensation Law.

All wage replacements and medical treatments are initially reviewed by NYSIF. If there is a dispute between NYSIF and the employee regarding such wage replacement or medical treatment, the Workers' Compensation Board will conduct a final review. Both the compensation costs and the medical costs are paid by NYSIF under the provisions of the workers' compensation Insuring Agreement between New York State and NYSIF.

Total first-year *compensation costs* increased in FY 2020-21 from \$32,053,151 to \$34,336,525, an increase of 7.1%. Total *medical costs* decreased in FY 2020-21 by 6.8%;

from \$28,145,378 to \$26,224,647.

The most notable decrease in both first-year compensation and medical costs occurred at the State Education Department (compensation costs decreased by 82.2% or \$87,737 and medical costs decreased by 67.0% or \$53,729). The Department of Health also saw declines in first-year costs (compensation costs decreased by 6.6% and medical costs decreased by 28.0%). The most notable increase in both first-year compensation and medical costs occurred at the Office of Parks and Recreation, with compensation costs increasing by 73.5% or \$160,391 and medical costs increasing by 35.0% or \$143,683.

Table 3B reports total compensation and medical costs for all workers' compensation payments made during the reported fiscal year for all incidents occurring on or before the end of the fiscal year (i.e., all open claims). Table 3B includes all bi-weekly temporary and permanent disability indemnity payments, Schedule Loss of Use (SLU) awards and Section 32 settlements in the *Total Compensation Costs* column and also displays *Total Medical Costs*. This table shows that *Total Compensation Costs* for all open claims increased by 4.6%, from \$357,833,794 in FY 2019-20 to \$374,118,490 in FY 2020-21, while *Total Medical Costs* for all open claims decreased 3.1%, from \$82,284,793 in FY 2019-20 to \$79,749,270 in FY 2020-21.

The most notable increase in total compensation costs from FY 2019-20 to FY 2020-21, occurred at the Office of Mental Health, with an overall increase in compensation costs of 8.9%, or \$5,566,848; overall compensation costs also increased at the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision, with a 7.3%, or \$11,965,111 increase. The State University of New York saw the most noteworthy year-to-year decrease in total compensation costs (12.7%, or \$1,942,038) and total medical costs (21.0%, or \$1,042,222), which is likely attributable to campus closures during the pandemic. The Department of Transportation also saw a substantial decrease in total compensation costs of 7.5%, or \$1,150,082, and total medical costs with an overall decrease of 8.8%, or \$389,429.

Tables 4A, 4B, 4C: Most Frequent Types of Injuries, Incident Causes, and Body Parts Injured: Fiscal Years 2016-17 through 2020-21

In the next series of tables, details are provided on the most frequent types of injuries (Table 4A), incident causes (Table 4B), and body parts injured (Table 4C) as specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision (6f). The data in all three tables was derived from all incidents that resulted in a workers' compensation claim during FY 2016-17 through FY 2020-21.

The source of the data for most of the agencies is the Accident Reporting System (ARS). Incidents were reported up to June 30th of the reporting year with incident dates occurring during the fiscal year. A 15-month reporting period was used to capture more complete incident activity that occurred during the fiscal year. The number of incidents differ from those reported on Table 1 as the source of the information in this table is ARS and the source of Table 1 is NYSIF. There are incidents that are put into ARS and a corresponding claim is not created in the NYSIF system (e.g., due to no lost time or medical costs). As noted in the Introduction, COVID-19-related incidents are shown in these tables as Injury Type *Covid-19 Coronavirus* in Table 4A, as Incident Cause *Pandemic* or *Inhalation of Substance* in Table 4B and as an increase to reported *Lung-*, *Chest-* and *Upper Extremities-*related injuries in Table 4C.

For the agencies using ARS, the *Occupational Injury and Illness Classification Manual* issued by the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics was used to capture the details on the types of injuries, incident causes, and body parts injured. This manual is the standard classification system used to classify occupational injuries and illnesses. Coding occupational injuries/illnesses is dependent upon the description provided by the individual reporting the incident, the classification system being used, and the codes selected by the individual entering the information. Certain categories may be viewed as similar, but they were reported separately in order to retain the integrity of the original reporting entity; for example, in Table 4B (page 58) *Falls*; *Fall to Floor*, *Walkway or Other Surface*; *Fall Downstairs or Steps*; and *Fall on Same Level* were reported as separate categories.

Table 4A, the Most Frequent Types of Injuries, include injury types in which the inclusion criteria accounted for over 98% of all incidents. Like prior years, four injury type categories accounted for almost seventy percent of all incidents in FY 2020-21: *Soreness, Pain, Hurt, Excluding the Back* (38.0%); *Sprains, Strains, Tears* (16.3%); *Back Pain, Hurt Back* (8.0%); and *Bruises, Contusions* (7.4%). However, unlike prior years, *COVID-19 Coronavirus* had the fifth largest incident rate of 5.5%.

The Most Frequent Incident Causes are detailed in Table 4B. The five most frequent incident causes for FY 2020-21 were *Bodily Reaction & Exertion* (12.4%); *Patient Restraint* (8.2%); *Falls* (5.4%); *Assault by Patient* (5.0%); and *Fall to Walkway, Floor or Other* Surface (4.7%). The greatest increases occurred in the following categories: *Pandemic* (increase of 2.9 percentage points) and *Bodily Reaction and Exertion* (increase of 1.1

percentage points). The greatest decreases occurred in the following categories: *Contact with Objects and Equipment* (decrease of 1.2 percentage points) and *Struck by Object* (decrease of 0.7 percentage points) *and Hitting, Kicking, Beating* (decrease of 0.6 percentage points).

The Body Parts Most Frequently Injured are listed in Table 4C and account for approximately 99% of all incidents. In five consecutive years, three body parts represented approximately one-third of the body parts injured: *Shoulder, Including Clavicle, Scapula* (13.2%); *Knee(s)* (13.1%); and *Back, Including Spine, Spinal Cord* (6.0%). Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been an increase occurred in the *Lung(s), Pleura* category (increase of 2.8 percentage points, related to COVID-19-related incidents). A decrease occurred in the *Multiple Back Regions* and the *Neck, Except Internal Location of Disease* category (decrease of 0.6 percentage points in each), and in the *Knee(s)* category (decrease of 0.5 percentage points).

Table 5 contains the job titles with at least 50 FTEs with incident rates greater than 25% above the average for all employees in FY 2020-21 as per *Chapter 171*, subdivision (**6g**). The average incident rate for all employees was 9.3% as reported in Table 1. The selected titles listed in Table 5 had an incident rate greater than 11.6% and a minimum of 50 FTEs to be included in the Table.

Incident rates increased in several of the titles listed in Table 5. Security Hospital Treatment Assistant had the highest incident rate of 109.4% in FY 2020-21, down from 135.7% in FY 2019-20. Over the five-year reporting period FY 2016-17 to FY 2020-21, the Incident Rate for this title has increased by 47 percentage points. Security Hospital Senior Treatment Assistant had the second highest incident rate of 88.4% in FY 2020-21, down from 98.9% in FY 2019-20.

The greatest incident rate decreases from FY 2019-20 to FY 2020-21 occurred in the following job titles: *Security Hospital Treatment Assistant* (as noted above), down 26.3 percentage points); *Youth Division Aide 4* (24.6 percentage points); and *Youth Division Aide 3* (24.5 percentage points).

Table 7 contains selected Executive Branch New York State negotiating units' workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision (6i). The information in Table 7 was provided by NYSIF from the claims for the respective fiscal years.

All negotiating units, except for the Security Services Unit, saw reductions in incident rates. The most significant reductions were in:

- The Security Supervisors Unit (Non-Arbitration), which saw a decrease of 19.1 percentage points (2 incidents in 2020-21 versus 12 incidents in 2019-20); and
- The Security Services Unit (Non-Arbitration), which saw a decrease of 6.1 percentage points (728 incidents in 2020-21 versus 838 incidents in 2019-20).

Recommendations

The following recommendations regarding the prevention of injury and illnesses and the reduction of costs due to these cases were prepared in consultation with the Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) and the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF).

Accidents at work and occupational injuries represent a considerable economic burden for New York State employees and the State of New York. NYSIF recommends a three-pronged approach for each New York State entity's Workers' Compensation Program. This includes Safety Management, Return to Work, and Fraud Prevention programs. Management commitment is essential for the implementation and on-going success of an agency's Workers' Compensation Program. Persons with the authority and responsibility for the Safety Management Program must be identified and given management's full support.

- Safety Management Program A Safety Management Program includes a comprehensive Injury and Illness Prevention Program along with defined Agency Safety Coordination to ensure accountability and implementation of the program. An effective injury and illness Prevention Program includes the following four elements: management commitment and employee involvement; worksite analysis; hazard prevention and control; and Injury and Illness prevention training. NYSIF is available to agencies to provide advice and consultation on the implementation of a Safety Management Program including access to loss control resources, materials, education, etc. Visit the Employer tab at nysif.com and choose Injury and Illness Prevention for more information about workplace safety programs, and access to NYSIF's free Safety Resources.
- Return to Work Program An active Return to Work Program is a key component in reducing cost by providing opportunities for injured workers to be productive while they recover from their injuries. New York State has several Return to Work programs, such as the Mandatory Alternate Duty Program, which are bargaining-unit specific and governed by the collective bargaining agreements. NYSIF and the Governor's Office of Employee Relations are resources to agencies in order to understand the terms and conditions of each program for the different negotiating units and how they relate to New York State's statutory obligation as an employer under the Workers' Compensation Law. NYSIF is available to agencies to provide advice and consultation including access to resources, materials, education, etc. Agency Safety Coordination is essential to ensuring accountability and implementation of each agency's Return to Work Program. Agencies should continue to communicate with the injured worker to assist and encourage their return to work. Our mutual goal is a favorable medical outcome and a successful return to work.
- Fraud Prevention Program Workers' Compensation Insurance fraud imposes a significant financial burden. An effective Fraud Prevention Program involves education and training, fraud and abuse detection, documentation, and reporting. NYSIF is committed to training staff and investigating agency

referrals of fraud and abuse.

The following are also recommended in an effort to prevent employees' Injuries and Illnesses:

- **System Improvements** The WCB continues to work on several system improvements as part of the ongoing Business Process Redesign project to improve stakeholder experience with the Board resulting in more timely, convenient, and efficient resolutions. As noted in prior reports, the Board fully implemented Virtual Hearings in early 2019. This award-winning initiative allows all parties in a workers' compensation hearing to participate remotely using their computer or mobile device. This has allowed the Board to continue to hold hearings throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, without interruption. Through this technology, the Board has achieved the highest level of claimant participation in hearings of 85%. In late 2019, the Board commenced a multi-year project to modernize the Business Information System used by all stakeholders. The first phases of this project will be implemented in 2021. When fully implemented, the new system (OnBoard) will vastly improve the Board's efficiency and data capture capabilities. The data from these new system improvements should be closely reviewed to identify trends and the need for further system enhancements.
- **Increase Awareness, Resources and Training** It is well-established that the sooner an accident is reported and the sooner the injured worker obtains needed medical and temporary disability benefits, the better the outcome for all involved. New York State should ensure that workers' compensation awareness is a top priority in every agency so that accidents are timely reported and injured workers receive timely care so that they may return to work as soon as possible. Staff at each agency should regularly receive training on workers' compensation policies so employees, managers, human resource officers, and payroll officers have a clear understanding of the resources available (including WCB's eCase), as well as the process and the requirements to receive the statutory and negotiated benefits, including supplemental pay, limited return to work, and dispute resolution programs. Each agency should set attainable goals on injury prevention and clearly define who and when to interact with injured employees and NYSIF. Further, agencies should define who is responsible for (and the importance of) timely reporting of the First Report of Injury (FROI), changes in work status (Form C-11), wages paid while on workers' compensation leave (Form C-256.2), and PAYSERV transactions, in compliance with the Office of State Comptroller Payroll Bulletin 1366.
- Data Sharing The eClaims initiative implemented in mid-2014 as well as recent improvements to the Board's data warehouse allow the possibility of flexible reporting of accident causes and locations, types of injuries, and temporary and permanent disability awards, by agency/facility. The Department of Civil Service, WCB, and NYSIF should explore how to most effectively share this data, as well as NYSIF claims data, with agencies to enable them to analyze the data, formulate corrective action plans, and enhance return to work programs.

APPENDIX A

CHAPTER 171

AN ACT to amend the civil service law, in relation to requiring annual reports about employee accident rates and costs in state agencies

Became a law July 3, 2007, with the approval of the Governor. Passed by a majority vote, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 7 of the civil service law is amended by adding a new subdivision 6 to read as follows:

- 6. The president of the commission shall prepare an annual report describing occupational injuries, illnesses, and workers' compensation experience for all state agencies as defined by subdivision three of section two-a of the state finance law. Such report shall be published no later than September thirtieth of each year, beginning in two thou- sand eight, and shall report information on the basis of the last completed state fiscal year. In subsequent years, the report shall include comparative data for up to five prior fiscal years if such data is available. The report shall be delivered to the governor, the legislature and to any labor organization that represents state agency employees and shall be available to the public. The contents of the report shall include the following information for each state agency, broken down by institutions and facilities as was done in the report previously published department entitled "Occupational Accidents and Compensation Experience for NYS Government Employees" published from nineteen hundred eighty-seven to nineteen hundred nine- ty-two:
- (a) the total number of employees, the number of work-related accidents and the rate of work-related injuries and illnesses;
- (b) the number of lost work time injuries and illnesses and the rate of lost work time cases;
- (c) the number of days of lost work time and the number and rate of lost full time employees;
 - (d) the cost to the state of lost work time due to work-related cases;
- (e) the cost to the state of medical expenses due to work-related injuries and illnesses;
- (f) a description of the types of injuries, the number of injuries and illnesses of each type and the most common causes of those cases, and the body part injured;
- (g) a list of the job titles with work-related injury and illness rates that are more than twenty-five percent above the average for all state agencies;
- (h) a list of the state agencies with work-related injury and illness rates that are more than twenty-five percent above the average for all state agencies;
- (i) work-related injury and illness rates for all state agencies by collective bargaining units; and

- (j) a summary of findings and recommendations prepared in consultation with the workers' compensation board and the state insurance fund for state agencies regarding the prevention of injury and illnesses and the reduction of costs due to these causes.
 - § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
