Brief Description of Class

Psychology Interns are graduate students who receive practical training and experience in clinical psychology by completing an internship program at a State facility, while working to attain an advanced degree in psychology. Under the direct supervision of a licensed psychologist, incumbents assist in the provision of psychological services to individuals* and groups; participate in areas of professional practice, such as treatment planning, psychological evaluation and assessment, clinical intervention, and research; and attend seminars and trainings on various topics and issues to develop professional competencies and skills in psychology.

Positions are non-competitive and classified in the Office of Mental Health and the Office for People With Developmental Disabilities.

*Individual refers to a person who is being treated or cared for, and is used in place of patient, client, or other nomenclature specific to an agency.

Distinguishing Characteristics

Psychology Intern: under the direct supervision of a licensed psychologist, assists in the provision of psychological services to individuals and groups in State facilities and programs.

Illustrative Tasks

Under the direct supervision of a licensed psychologist, participates in the provision of psychological services to individuals and groups.

- Assists in the administration, scoring, and interpretation of psychological tests; conducting psychological evaluations and assessments, and psychotherapy sessions; and development of individual treatment plans and clinical interventions.
- Maintains documentation, such as individual histories, treatment plans, and progress notes; and drafts psychological evaluation and assessment reports.

- Functions as a member of an interdisciplinary treatment team; and attends team meetings and case conferences.
- Attends trainings and seminars on various topics and issues in psychology.

Minimum Qualifications

Psychology Intern

Non-Competitive: enrollment in an accredited psychology program and completion of 30 graduate semester hours leading to an advanced degree in psychology.
