This suggestion eliminated safety issues during night operation in which the drivers experienced loss of lights on the rear of the vehicle and on the dash light controls and instruments. This suggestion is of limited application and moderate value for the NYS Department of Transportation (DOT). This suggestion is being implemented on DOT trucks throughout the State. It affects only one program area and saves a great deal of time (previously when the lights shorted out, the trucks would need to pull off the road until the lights are fixed). In the future, this suggestion will save DOT money for replacement tail light parts. Mr. Donnery's suggestion facilitated the overall efficiency of fraudulent documents and better utilizes information that has been recorded. While the use of digital scanners is not an original idea in the DMV, the agency did want to award Mr. Donnery for his insight. With this in mind, DMV recommended a Certificate of Merit Only with no monetary award.
