

Annual Report of New York State Government Employees' Workers' Compensation Claims

Fiscal Year 2024-25

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Introduction

Background

This is the Department of Civil Service's seventeenth annual report, "New York State Government Employees' Workers' Compensation Claims." The report includes workers' compensation experience from five fiscal years (2020-21 through 2024-25).

Section 7 of the Civil Service Law was amended in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007 (Appendix A of this report) to require that the President of the Civil Service Commission prepare an annual report describing occupational injuries, illnesses, and workers' compensation claims in Executive Branch state agencies. The report is required to be published by September 30th each year and includes workers' compensation data based on the last completed fiscal year, as well as comparative data for up to five fiscal years.

The report format follows the sections specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, with the exception of Table 3A which consolidates subdivisions (**6d**) and (**6e**) of the legislation. Further, Table 3B, which is not required by the statute, displays five years of total compensation and medical payments made during the applicable fiscal year for <u>all</u> ARS-reported incidents elevated to Claim Type status occurring between April 1, 2024, and March 31, 2025, with incidents reported by June 30, 2025.

The Department of Civil Service's Employee Benefits Division is responsible for overseeing the workers' compensation insuring agreement between New York State and the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF). Part of this responsibility includes the reporting and monitoring of work-related incidents through the Accident Reporting System (ARS) and workers' compensation claims experience provided by NYSIF. Workers' compensation data for this report was obtained from both the ARS and NYSIF since neither source alone contains all the statutorily required data elements.

Incidents were reported up to June 30th of the reporting year, with incident dates occurring during the fiscal year. A 15-month reporting period was used to capture more complete incident activity that occurred during the fiscal year. There were 11 ARS-reported COVID-19-related incidents, which are captured in this report and are seen as Injury Type "COVID-19 Coronavirus" in Table 4A, primarily as Incident Cause "Pandemic" in Table 4B and primarily in the Lungs, related injuries in Table 4C.

It should be noted that there are differences in the number of work-related incidents contained in the respective data reported from the ARS and NYSIF. There are incidents that are submitted to ARS but are not elevated to "Claim Type" status if the incident is not reasonably expected to incur medical expenses or lost time of more than one day or one shift. Conversely, there may be claims for which a report was not made in ARS. Employee population data is obtained from the Department of Civil Service New York State Electronic Personnel System (NYSTEP).

Incident counts will be described in detail throughout the report. Statewide, there was a 2.5%decrease in the number of incidents, along with a 5.1% decrease in the number of incidents that led to lost days from last year. Over the five-year reporting period, work-related incidents have increased by

14.8% and the number of incidents that led to lost days decreased by 0.5%.

Although this report presents only summarized data, New York State agency Human Resources and Health and Safety staff are encouraged to use the reporting capabilities of the ARS. The ARS allows for much greater detail of the information presented in this report, as well as many other workers' compensation incident details.

Explanatory Notes

The report *includes* selected Executive Branch agencies' Classified Service employees, consistent with subdivision three of section two-a of the State Finance Law. Specifically, employees represented by the following public employee unions are included: CSEA; PEF; NYSCOPBA; Council 82; PBANYS as well as Management/Confidential. The report *excludes* the Judicial and Legislative branches, as well as the Unclassified Service and Authorities (e.g., Division of State Police, Financial Control Board, SUNY College of Ceramics) as the Department of Civil Service does not maintain employee data on these groups. The report further *excludes* workers' compensation costs data for NYSIF from Table 3B: Workers' Compensation Costs Paid in Reporting Year. As the entire expense of administering the state insurance fund shall be paid out of the fund, NYSIF is responsible for the cost of its employee claims, and therefore the compensation costs and medical costs for NYSIF are not a cost to the State under Civil Service Law Section 7(6)(d) and (e).

There were two agency or facility closures, in FY 2024-25. The New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision closed both their Great Meadow and Sullivan Correctional Facilities effective 11/6/2024. There were no new agencies.

Information in this report is based on New York State workers' compensation claims filed by employees. Although the reporting period is for the Fiscal Years (FY) ending March 31st, claims for fiscal years were reviewed through June 30th of the respective reporting years to allow for late reporting, and for data to be captured for workers' compensation determinations made after the end of the fiscal year.

Incident data included in this report are for work-related incidents (either injuries or occupational illnesses) that were reported to the Workers' Compensation Board and NYSIF as required by the New York State Workers' Compensation Law. The Law requires reporting of all incidents that result in either: one or more lost workdays or shifts beyond the working day or shift on which the incident occurred; or medical treatment beyond first aid or two or more first aid treatments. There are many incidents that do not reach the level of the reporting criteria under the Workers' Compensation Law. Incident Rates in Table 5 can be over 100 given that multiple incidents may occur for the same individual and due to staff turnover (FTE counts are point-in-time and an incident may be counted for an individual no longer on the agency's payroll).

As historically reported, this report includes certain statutory temporary disability workers' compensation costs incurred by Executive Branch employees and paid by the State Insurance Fund for one day up to 365 days' post-incident (based on the date the injury occurred within the fiscal year). For example, an accident that occurs on April 1st could have up to 365 days of compensation, whereas an accident that occurs on March 31st could have only one day of compensation reported. **Please note that the report**

includes Table 3B, which reports total compensation and medical payments made during the reported fiscal year, for all incidents occurring on or before the end of the fiscal year (i.e., payments for all open claims).

Summary of Findings

Highlights are presented below for Executive Branch agency workers' compensation incidents for classified employees incurred in FY 2020-21 through FY 2024-25.

- There were 14,618 work-related claims in FY 2024-25 compared to 14,993 work-related claims in FY 2023-24; 13,264 work-related claims in FY 2022-23; 12,957 work-related claims in FY 2021-22; and 12,731 work-related claims in FY 2020-21. The overall workers' compensation incident rate decreased from 11.4% to 10.8%. Table 1 highlights the increase in the workforce from 2023-24. Over the entire reporting period, work-related incidents have increased by 14.8% (Table 1, page 8).
- Lost-time incidents decreased by 5.1% in FY 2024-25; there were 4,854 incidents compared to 5,116 in FY 2023-24. Approximately 33.2% of workers' compensation incidents in FY 2024-25 resulted in lost time (down from 34.1% in FY 2023-24) (Table 2A, page 18).
- The lost-time incident rate decreased from 3.9% in FY 2023-24 to 3.6% in FY 2024-25. In FY 2024-25, there were 315,356 lost workdays lost compared to 303,805 in FY 2023-24 (Table 2B, page 26).
- Total compensation costs increased by 8.4% from \$36,055,739 in FY 2023-24 to \$39,088,650 in FY 2024-25. Total medical costs increased by 10% from \$29,483,347 to \$32,444,082. These increases were driven by higher compensation costs in the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision and higher medical costs in the Office of Mental Health and Office for People with Developmental Disabilities. (Table 3A, page 37).
- Total compensation costs for all open claims decreased from \$417,582,877 in FY 2023-24 to \$404,067,008 in FY 2024-25. Total medical costs for all open claims increased from \$91,067,531 in FY 2023-24 compared to \$91,635,870 in FY 2024-25. The Department of Corrections and Community Supervision, Office of Mental Health and Office for People with Developmental Disabilities had decreases in compensation costs. (Table 3B, page 45).
- Soreness, Pain, Hurt Excluding the Back continues to be the category of incidents with the highest incident rate at 38.7% for FY 2024-25, down from 40.4% in FY 2023-24. Sprains, Strains, Tears again ranked second with an incident rate of 15.4% for FY 2024-25, down from 16.6% in FY 2023-24. (Table 4A, page 56).
- For the ninth consecutive year, the two leading incident causes were: *Bodily Reaction and Exertion* and *Patient Restraint* (Table 4B, page 59).
- Knee, Shoulder, and Back were the top injured body part groups for all five fiscal years: Knee (14.0%incident rate), Shoulder (13.9% incident rate); and Back (11.7% incident rate).
- More specific body codes are now available (e.g., Ear, Left, Finger Middle, Right) rather than

"Ear(s)" or "Hand(s) and Finger(s)" and similar body parts are grouped together and subtotaled. Also, some less specific body parts have been eliminated (e.g., "Arm(s)" or "Knee(s)" and "Leg(s)". The new Body Parts are noted with an asterisk (*) and the eliminated Body Parts are noted with two asterisks (**) and footnoted in Table 4C, page 63.

- The three job titles with the highest number of work-related incidents for the fifth consecutive year were: Correction Officer, Direct Support Assistant, and Mental Health Therapy Aide. Security Hospital Treatment Assistant had the highest incident rate of 138.7% in FY 2024-25. Security Hospital Senior Treatment Assistant had the second highest incident rate of 98.9% in FY 2024-25. The job titles with the most significant increase in FY 2024-25 were: Correction Officer Spanish Language (incident rate of 89.3%, up from 57.5% in FY 2023-24), and Youth Support Coordinator 1 (incident rate of 31.3%, up from 3.1% in FY 2023-24). As noted in the Explanatory Notes, Incident Rates in Table 5 can be over 100 given that multiple incidents may occur for the same individual and due to staff turnover (FTE counts are point-in-time and an incident may be counted for an individual no longer on the agency's payroll). (Table 5, page 70).
- The two facilities with the highest incident rates in FY 2024-25 were the *Edgecombe Correctional Facility* (incident rate of 35.3%, up from 9.7%in FY 2023-24) and the *Five Points Correctional Facility* (incident rate of 56.3%, up from 35.4% in FY 2023-24). (Table 6, page 73).
- In FY 2024-25, Security Services Unit had the highest incident rate of 47.3%, and All Other Units and Unrepresented Group had the lowest incident rate of 0.8%. The Security Services Unit Non-Arbitration had the second highest incident rate of 43.0%, up from 43.6%in FY 2023-24 (Table 7, page 77).

Table 1: Workers' Compensation Incident Details Selected New York State Agencies Fiscal Years 2020-21 through 2024-25

Table 1 lists the selected Executive Branch New York State agencies' workers' compensation details required by *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision **(6a)**. The work-related incident information in Table 1 was provided by NYSIF. The FY 2024-25 claims experience includes accidents occurring between April 1, 2024, and March 31, 2025, and reported through June 30, 2025.

Agencies reported a total of 14,618 workers' compensation incidents and an incident rate of 10.8% in FY 2024-25, compared to 14,993 incidents and an incident rate of 11.4% in FY 2023-24. Previous years reported: 13,264 incidents and an incident rate of 10.3% in FY 2022-232; 12,957 incidents and an incident rate of 10.0% in FY 2021-22; and 12,731 incidents and an incident rate of 9.3% in FY 2020-21.

The overall incident rate is down overall (10.8% versus 11.4% last year). Table 1 highlights an increase in the workforce from 2023-24. Over the entire reporting period, work-related incidents have increased by 14.8%.

Marcy Correctional Facility and Bronx Psychiatric Center both saw significant reductions in the Incident Rates (19% decrease and 17% decrease, respectively). Conversely, Edgecombe Correctional Facility and Five Points Correctional Facility both saw significant Incident Rate increases (26.0% and 21% respectively).

Tables 2A and 2B: Workers' Compensation Lost Time Selected New York State Agencies Fiscal Years 2020-21 through 2024-25

Table 2A and **Table 2B** list the selected Executive Branch agencies' workers' compensation details required by *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivisions (**6b**), and (**6c**). The FY 2024-25 claims experience includes accidents occurring between April 1, 2024, and March 31, 2025, and reported through June 30, 2025. The FY 2023-24, 2022-23, 2021-22, and FY 2020-21 claims experience is the same data reported in last year's report.

The number of lost-time incidents decreased from 5,116 in FY 2023-24 to 4,854 in FY 2024-25, a decrease of 5.1%. The lost-time case rate (the number of Lost Time Incidents divided by the number of Incidents from Table 1) decreased from 34.1% in FY 2023-24 to 33.2% in FY 2024-25.

The lost-time rate (the number of Lost Time Incidents divided by the number of Full Time Equivalents) decreased from 3.9% in FY 2023-24 to 3.6% in FY 2024-25. The number of lost workdays increased from 303,805 in FY 2023-24 to 315,356 in FY 2024-25, an increase of 3.8%.

Lost workdays at the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision increased. In 2024-25, there were 123,024 lost workdays while in FY 2023-24, there were 109,831 lost workdays. Lost workdays increased at *Sullivan Correctional Facility* (145.6%), *Mid-State Correctional Facility* (119.7%), and *Fishkill Correctional Facility* (91.6%). Lost workdays also increased at the Office of Mental Health from 53,631 in FY 2023-24 to 63,249 in FY 2024-25.

Conversely, the number of lost workdays decreased at the Office of People with Development Disabilities by 13.3%, from 80,376 in FY 2023-24 to 69,657 in FY 2024-25. Lost workdays also decreased at the Department of Health by 36.8%, from 2,796 in FY 2023-24, to 1,766 in 2024-25.

Table 3A and 3B: Workers' Compensation Costs by Selected New York State Agencies Fiscal Years 2020-21 through 2024-25

Table 3A lists the selected Executive Branch New York State agencies and contains the workers' compensation details required by *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivisions (**6d**) and (**6e**). The claims cost in Table 3A was provided by NYSIF. The FY 2024-25 claims cost includes incidents occurring between April 1, 2024, and March 31, 2025, and paid through June 30, 2025. The FY 2020-21, FY 2021-22, FY 2022-23 and FY 2023 -24 claims cost is the same data reported in last year's report.

The compensation costs included in Table 3A only represents certain statutory temporary disability workers' compensation costs incurred by Executive Branch employees and paid by the State Insurance Fund for one day up to 365 days post-incident (based on the date the injury occurred within the year). For example, an accident that occurs on April 1 could have to up 365 days of compensation whereas an accident that occurs on March 31st could have only one day of compensation reported.

Under New York State Workers' Compensation Law, employees who are disabled due to a workers' compensation incident are entitled to a wage replacement for lost salary and medical benefits related to the incident. The wage component is equal to two-thirds of the employee's average weekly wage, not to exceed a maximum established under the Workers' Compensation Law. The statutory maximum for the past five years is as follows:

July 2020 - June 30, 2021	\$966.78
July 2021 – June 30, 2022	\$1,063.05
July 2022 – June 30, 2023	\$1,125.46
July 2023 – June 30, 2024	\$1,145.43
July 2024 – June 30, 2025	\$1,171.46

The data in Table 3A does not include supplemental wage replacement benefits as these amounts are paid by individual agencies and are not reflected in data maintained by NYSIF. Under the medical component, all medical treatments – including doctor treatments, hospital or clinic charges, imaging services and diagnostic testing, prescription medication, and other related medical services – are paid in full based on a fee schedule established by the Chair of the Workers' Compensation Board, pursuant to the Workers' Compensation Law.

All wage replacements and medical treatments are initially reviewed by NYSIF. If there is a dispute between NYSIF and the employee regarding such wage replacement or medical treatment, the Workers' Compensation Board will conduct a final review. Both the compensation costs and the medical costs are paid by NYSIF under the provisions of the workers' compensation Insuring

Agreement between New York State and NYSIF.

Total first-year *compensation costs* increased from \$36,055,739 in FY 2023-24 to \$39,088,650 in FY 2024-25, an increase of 8.4%. In addition, total *medical costs* increased in FY 2024-25 by 10.0%, from \$29,483,347 to \$32,444,082.

The most notable increase in first-year *compensation costs* occurred at the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS) (*compensation costs in*creased by 28.5% or \$2,578,867). The Office of Mental Health had the largest increase in *medical costs* increasing from \$6,159,299 in FY 2023-24 to \$7,117,738 in FY 2024-25 (an increase of \$958,439). The largest decrease in *compensation costs* occurred at the Office for People with Developmental Disabilities, with *compensation costs* decreasing by \$1,440,204 or 12.2%.

Table 3B reports total compensation and medical costs for all workers' compensation payments made during the reported fiscal year for all incidents occurring on or before the end of the fiscal year (i.e., all open claims). Table 3B includes all bi-weekly temporary and permanent disability indemnity payments, Schedule Loss of Use (SLU) awards and Section 32 settlements in the *Total Compensation Costs* column and also displays *Total Medical Costs*. This table shows that *Total Compensation Costs* for all open claims decreased by 3.2%, from \$417,582,877 in FY 2023-24 to \$404,067,008 in FY 2024-25, and *Total Medical Costs* for all open claims *increased* by 0.6% from \$91,067,531 in FY 2023-24 to \$91,635,870 in FY 2024-25.

The most notable decrease in total compensation costs from FY 2023-24 to FY 2024-25, occurred at the Office of Mental Health with an overall decrease in compensation costs of 8.1% or \$5,994,427. The Office for People with Developmental Disabilities had the second highest overall decrease in compensation costs of 3.0% or \$1,879,788.

Tables 4A, 4B, 4C: Most Frequent Types of Injuries, Incident Causes, and Body Parts Injured Fiscal Years 2020-21 through 2024-25

In the next series of tables, details are provided on the most frequent types of injuries (Table 4A), incident causes (Table 4B), and body parts injured (Table 4C) as specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision (**6f**). The data in all three tables was derived from all incidents that resulted in a workers' compensation claim during FY 2020-21 through FY 2024-25.

Readers will see increased specificity to Body Parts in Table 4C as ARS reflects the changes made by WCB to upgrade eClaims to the International Association of Industrial Accident Boards and Commissions' (IAIABC) version R3.1 Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) standard. The system enhancements were implemented in January 2022. More specific body codes are now available (e.g., Ear, Left, Finger – Middle, Right) rather than "Ear(s)" or "Hand(s) and Finger(s)" and these new Body Parts are noted with an asterisk (*) and are footnoted in Table 4C. In addition, less specific body codes (e.g., Wrist(s), Leg(s) and Knee(s)" have been removed during FY2022-23 and are noted with two asterisks (**) and are footnoted in Table 4C.

The source of the data for most of the agencies is the Accident Reporting System (ARS). Incidents were reported up to June 30th of the reporting year with incident dates occurring during the fiscal year. A 15-month reporting period was used to capture more complete incident activity that occurred during the fiscal year. The number of work-related incidents differ from those reported on Table 1 as the source of the incident information in this table is ARS and the source of the incident information in Table 1 is NYSIF. There are incidents that are submitted to ARS, but are not elevated to "Claim Type" status if the incident is not reasonably expected to incur medical expenses or lost time of more than one day or one shift. Conversely, there may be claims for which a report was not made in ARS.

For the agencies using ARS, the *Occupational Injury and Illness Classification Manual* issued by the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics was used to capture the details on the types of injuries, incident causes, and body parts injured. This manual is the standard classification system used to classify occupational injuries and illnesses. Coding occupational injuries/illnesses is dependent upon the description provided by the individual reporting the incident, the classification system being used, and the codes selected by the individual entering the information. Certain categories may be viewed as similar, but they are reported separately in order to retain the integrity of the original reporting entity. For example, in Table 4B (page 58) *Falls*; *Fall to Floor, Walkway or Other Surface*; *Fall Downstairs or Steps*; and *Fall on Same Level* are reported as separate categories.

Table 4A, the Most Frequent Types of Injuries, include injury types in which the inclusion criteria accounted for over 98% of all incidents. Four injury type categories accounted for almost seventy percent of all incidents in FY 2024-25: Soreness, Pain, Hurt, Excluding the Back (38.7%); Sprains, Strains, Tears (15.4%); Back Pain, Hurt Back (6.7%); and Bruises Contusions (6.6%).

The Most Frequent Incident Causes are detailed in Table 4B. The five most frequent incident causes for FY 2024-25 were *Bodily Reaction & Exertion* (13.8%); *Patient Restraint* (8.4%); *Assault by Patient* (6.5%); *Assaults and Violent Acts by Person(s)* (5.9%); and *Falls* (5.1%). The greatest increases occurred in the following categories: *Assaults and Violent Acts by Person(s)* (increase of 1.4 percentage points) and *Falls* (increase of 1.2 percentage points).

The greatest decreases occurred in the following categories: Assaults and Violent Acts, Unspecified (decrease of 1.2 percentage points) and Hitting, Kicking, Beating (decrease of 0.8 percentage points).

The Body Parts Most Frequently Injured are listed in Table 4C and account for approximately 99% of all incidents. In five consecutive years, three body part groups represented almost forty percent of the body parts injured: *Knee* (14.0%), *Shoulder* (13.9%); and *Back* (11.7%).

Table 5 contains the job titles with at least 50 FTEs with incident rates greater than 25% above the average for all employees in FY 2024-25 as required by *Chapter 171 of the Laws of 2007*, subdivision (**6g**). The average incident rate for all employees was 10.8% as reported in Table 1. The selected titles listed in Table 5 had an incident rate greater than 13.5% and a minimum of 50 FTEs to be included in the Table.

While the overall incident rate decreased by 5.3%, Security Hospital Treatment Assistant had the highest incident rate of 138.7% in FY 2024-25, up from 127.6% in FY 2023-24. Over the five-year reporting period FY 2020-21 to FY 2024-25, the Incident Rate for this title has increased by 29.3 percentage points. Security Hospital Senior Treatment Assistant had the second highest incident rate of 98.9% in FY 2024-25, higher than the rate of 76.1% in FY 2023-24.

The greatest incident rate decreases from FY 2023-24 to FY 2024-25 occurred in the following job titles: Secure Care Treatment Aide 2, (down 21.2 percentage points); and Dev Disability Secure Care Treatment Aide 1 (down 11.6 percentage points).

Subdivision (**6h**) of *Chapter 171 of the Laws of 2007* specifies that the Workers' Compensation Annual Report provide a list of State agencies with work-related injuries and illness rates that are more than 25% above the average incident rate for all State agencies. The average incident rate for all employees was 10.8% as reported in Table 1. The agencies listed in **Table 6** had an incident rate greater than 13.5% in FY 2024-25. The reader is referred to Table 1 for a listing of all State agencies and their respective incident rates.

Table 7 contains selected Executive Branch New York State negotiating units' workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision (**6i**). The work-related incident information in Table 7 was provided by NYSIF from the claims for the respective fiscal years.

Some negotiating units saw increases in incident rates while others had lower incident rates than 2023-24. The most significant changes were:

- The largest increase in rate was the Security Services Unit with an increase of 4.6 percentage points.
- The largest decrease in rate was the Security Supervisors Unit (Non-Arbitration) with a decrease of 6.2 percentage points.

Recommendations

The following recommendations regarding the prevention of injury and illnesses and the reduction of costs due to these cases were prepared in consultation with the Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) and the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF).

Accidents at work and occupational injuries represent a considerable economic burden for New York State employees and the State of New York. NYSIF recommends a three-pronged approach for each New York State entity's Workers' Compensation Program. This includes Safety Management, Return to Work, and Fraud Prevention programs. Management commitment is essential for the implementation and on-going success of an agency's Workers' Compensation Program. Persons with the authority and responsibility for the Safety Management Program must be identified and given management's full support.

- Safety Management Program A Safety Management Program includes a comprehensive Injury and Illness Prevention Program along with defined Agency Safety Coordination to ensure accountability and implementation of the program. An effective injury and illness Prevention Program includes the following four elements: management commitment and employee involvement; worksite analysis; hazard prevention and control; and Injury and Illness prevention training. NYSIF is available to agencies to provide advice and consultation on the implementation of a Safety Management Program including access to loss control resources, materials, education, etc. Visit the Employer tab at nysif.com and choose Injury and Illness Prevention for more information about workplace safety programs, and access to NYSIF's free Safety Resources, including Free Resource from NYSIF to Help Manage Risk NYSIF Risk Control Resource Center.
- Return to Work Program An active Return to Work Program is a key component in reducing cost by providing opportunities for injured workers to be productive while they recover from their injuries. New York State has several Return to Work programs, such as the Mandatory Alternate Duty Program, which are bargaining-unit specific and governed by the collective bargaining agreements. NYSIF and the Office of Employee Relations are resources to agencies in order to understand the terms and conditions of each program for the different negotiating units and how they relate to New York State's statutory obligation as an employer under the Workers' Compensation Law. NYSIF is available to agencies to provide advice and consultation including access to resources, materials, education, etc. Agency Safety Coordination is essential to ensuring accountability and implementation of each agency's Return to Work Program. Agencies should continue to communicate with the injured worker to assist and encourage their return to work. Our mutual goal is a favorable medical outcome and a successful return to work.
- Fraud Prevention Program Workers' Compensation Insurance fraud imposes a significant financial burden. An effective Fraud Prevention Program involves education and training, fraud and abuse detection, documentation, and reporting. NYSIF is committed to training staff and investigating agency referrals of fraud and abuse.

The following are also recommended in an effort to prevent employees' Injuries and Illnesses:

- System Improvements The Board continues to make progress incrementally on our multi-year OnBoard modernization and business process reengineering program. The program is comprised of a series of projects focused on modernizing the Board's aging legacy claims management systems. The modernization is grounded in eliminating paper processing at the Board and leveraging electronic data channels to bring about significant efficiency gains in the overall system. The Board continues to enhance the first phase of the OnBoard platform which went live in 2022 with new medical portal eForm features allowing electronic submission, review, and approvals of the Prior Authorization Request (PAR) process as well as Disputed Medical Bills (HP-1). The electronic PAR process allows for direct electronic interaction between Medical Providers, Payors, and the Board. The Board is pleased to share that we've hit our two millionth PAR submission! Even more exciting, with all two million of these submissions, only 9% of these PARs have needed escalation to the Board's Medical Director's Office (MDO) for review – meaning less processing time for the majority of PARs submitted, resulting in more efficient and effective delivery of benefits to injured workers. 91% of PARs have been resolved without MDO (Level 3) review within 30 days. For the other 9%, almost all medication, durable medical equipment (DME), behavioral health, and "carrier unknown" PARs have been resolved on the same or next business day. These enhancements and diligent response times make for a better stakeholder experience and improve the workers' compensation system. The Board continues to add new features within the OnBoard platform, including the replacement of the paper Request for Request for Action form (RFA-1C) with new eForm submittal options. The RFA-1LC electronic submittal options include web submission within the Board's eCase application, as well as XML submission options via API and XML files that enable stakeholder computer systems to communicate directly with the Board's system. Moving this process from paper to electronic has significantly improved response times for claimant stakeholders, reduced time spent on manual review and follow-ups and decreased the time for the form to appear in the case file from 7-10 days (minimum) through paper submission to under an hour through the new electronic process. The Board will also implement another Request for Action form (RFA-2) in early 2026 which is expected to see similar efficiencies for the Insurance Carrier/Payer channel of the same process. Over the next few years, the Board will focus modernization efforts on our core internal and external claims management software to greater enhance our ability to deliver additional digital transformations, all geared toward achieving dramatic increases in system efficiencies as we strive to improve stakeholder experience for injured workers and the employers of NYS.
- Increase Awareness, Resources and Training It is well-established that the sooner an accident is reported and the sooner the injured worker obtains needed medical and temporary disability benefits, the better the outcome for all involved. New York State should ensure that workers' compensation awareness is a top priority in every agency so that accidents are timely reported and injured workers receive timely care so that they may return to work as soon as possible. Staff at each agency should regularly receive training on workers' compensation policies so employees, managers, human resource officers, and payroll officers have a clear understanding of the resources available (including WCB's eCase), as well as the process and the requirements to receive the statutory and negotiated benefits, including supplemental pay, limited return to work, and dispute resolution programs. Each agency should set attainable goals on injury prevention and clearly define who and when to interact with injured employees and NYSIF. Further, agencies should define who is responsible for

(and the importance of) timely reporting of the First Report of Injury (FROI), changes in work status (Form C-11), wages paid while on workers' compensation leave (Form C-256.2), and PAYSERV transactions, in compliance with the Office of State Comptroller Payroll Bulletin 1366.

• Data Sharing –The Department of Civil Service, WCB, and NYSIF should explore how to most effectively share Board data, as well as NYSIF claims data, with agencies to enable them to analyze the data, formulate corrective action plans, and enhance return to work programs.

APPENDIX A

CHAPTER 171

AN ACT to amend the civil service law, in relation to requiring annual reports about employee accident rates and costs in state agencies

Became a law July 3, 2007, with the approval of the Governor. Passed by a majority vote, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 7 of the civil service law is amended by adding a new subdivision 6 to read as follows:

- 6. The president of the commission shall prepare an annual report describing occupational injuries, illnesses, and workers' compensation experience for all state agencies as defined by subdivision three of section two-a of the state finance law. Such report shall be published no later than September thirtieth of each year, beginning in two thou- sand eight, and shall report information on the basis of the last completed state fiscal year. In subsequent years, the report shall include comparative data for up to five prior fiscal years if such data is available. The report shall be delivered to the governor, the legislature and to any labor organization that represents state agency employees and shall be available to the public. The contents of the report shall include the following information for each state agency, broken down by institutions and facilities as was done in the report previously published by the department entitled "Occupational Accidents and Workers' Compensation Experience for NYS Government Employees" published from nineteen hundred eighty-seven to nineteen hundred nine- ty-two:
- (a) the total number of employees, the number of work-related accidents and the rate of work-related injuries and illnesses;
- (b) the number of lost work time injuries and illnesses and the rate of lost work time cases;
- (c) the number of days of lost work time and the number and rate of lost full time employees;
 - (d) the cost to the state of lost work time due to work-related cases;
- (e) the cost to the state of medical expenses due to work-related injuries and illnesses;
- (f) a description of the types of injuries, the number of injuries and illnesses of each type and the most common causes of those cases, and the body part injured;
- (g) a list of the job titles with work-related injury and illness rates that are more than twenty-five percent above the average for all state agencies;
- (h) a list of the state agencies with work-related injury and illness rates that are more than twenty-five percent above the average for all state agencies;
- (i) work-related injury and illness rates for all state agencies by collective bargaining units; and
 - (j) a summary of findings and recommendations prepared in consultation

with the workers' compensation board and the state insurance fund for state agencies regarding the prevention of injury and illnesses and the reduction of costs due to these causes.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
