Chief of Program Planning, Grade 25

Brief Description of Class

Chiefs of Program Planning are responsible for supervising program evaluation and policy analysis activities. These positions are located within the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS).

Distinguishing Characteristics

Chief of Program Planning: under the supervision of higher-level program evaluation and policy analysis staff, supervises Program Research Specialists 2 and 3, and/or other professional staff.

Related Classes

Program Research Specialists plan studies; collect and analyze data; interpret and report findings on current or proposed programs, policies, and legislation related to such programs; and perform similar related research and analytical activities.

Illustrative Duties

Monitors and evaluates DOCCS programs and their outcomes.

Designs, conducts, and formulates program plans and evaluations.

Resolves methodological issues.

Represents the agency and liaisons with DOCCS staff, research partners, and other State agencies.

Supervises the work of professional staff assigned to the unit, ensuring the timely and accurate completion of work and the appropriate coordination with other parties.

Performs the full range of supervisory duties such as reviewing and evaluating work, time and attendance, and performance evaluations.

Minimum Qualifications

Chief of Program Planning

Promotion: one year of permanent service as a Program Research Specialist 3.
