Lottery Video Product Manager, M-2

Brief Description of Class

Lottery Video Product Manager administers the design and implementation of video gaming operations in the Division of Gaming at the New York State Gaming Commission.

Distinguishing Characteristics

One-position class; under the general direction of the Deputy Director, Division of Gaming or Lottery Game Director, administers video gaming operations and supervises Lottery Supervising Research Specialist and Program Research Specialist 2.

Related Classes

Director Lottery Games Operations directs statewide Lottery operations at the New York State Gaming Commission.

Lottery Games Directors oversee all day-to-day statewide operations for lottery, online and instant games at the New York State Gaming Commission.

Illustrative Duties

Recommends initial product placement for new locations and relocated or redesigned video gaming casinos; maintains policies for product management, software testing results, promotions, and game development; reviews and evaluates new themes to ensure compliance with New York State gaming standards; evaluates changes to product mix-placement, signage, payouts, and denominations and looks for ways to improve performance; develops performance trend models and promotional performance analysis; liaises with casinos and video gaming manufacturers; and performs the full range of supervisory duties of staff.

Minimum Qualifications

Open Competitive: Nine years of business experience in lottery or slot gaming operations including two at a supervisory level.

An associate degree may substitute for two years of specialized experience; bachelor's degree may substitute for four years of specialized experience; master's degree may substitute for five years of specialized experience; J.D. may substitute for six years of specialized experience; Ph.D. may substitute for seven years of specialized experience.

Standards cannot and do not include all the work that might be appropriately performed by a class. The minimum qualifications above are those required for appointment at the time the Classification Standard was written.
